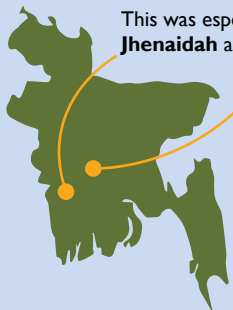

Safe and orderly migration

77.5% associate safe migration with securing a job with a good company

This was especially the case in the districts of **Jhenaidah** and **Madaripur**



50.7% of all respondents would bring a passport, work visa and contract

14.7% would bring a passport and a visa



45.3% thinks that migrating with a proper work visa generates a better income and will ensure greater protection

Preferred source of assistance for migration



Most migrants prefer to migrate through their social networks

71% intends to migrate through relatives and **19%** through the help of a broker

Trusted sources for visa validation



44.2% correctly believes that a visa can be validated by a DEMO office or other government channels

55.8% did not list the correct answer or did not know

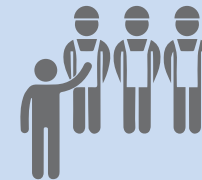
Labour rights



Only **18.8%** of all respondents had a good level of knowledge on the indicators listed in labour standards

- Freedom from forced labour
- Freedom from child labour
- Freedom from discrimination at work
- Freedom to form and join a union and to bargain collectively

Labour contract



Only **21.5%** of all respondents had a good level of knowledge on the contents of a labour contract

- Employment period
- Wages and overtime pay
- Working hours and rest time
- Benefits
- Job duties
- Rules about termination

Sources of assistance in emergency situation



In cases of emergency, **51.75%** of migrants would contact their embassy or consulate, while **44.2%** would contact friends and family
