

Identification of returnees:

Since March 2021, 60 volunteers and 10 supervisors have been working to identify returning migrants in 10 districts where Reintegration Service Centers (RSC) are not established. In March, volunteers and supervisors identified a total of 277 returnees while 201 returnees were considered eligible for assistance following the screening process. They reviewed the list and identified 201 returnees as eligible to be profiled as project beneficiaries. Among the 201 eligible returnees, 193 returned from the EU Member States & UK and eight returned from Turkey.

Migration Governance

Two-day training for Executive Magistrates:

On 14th and 15th March 2021, IOM Bangladesh in collaboration with the Ministry of Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment (MoEWOE) organized a training to enhance the capacity of the Executive Magistrates to mitigate malpractices in labour migration based on a comprehensive module.





Mr. Imran Ahmad, MP, Honourable Minister MoEWOE, inaugurated the training. Dr. Ahmed Munirus Saleheen, Secretary of MoEWOE, Md. Shamsul Alam, Director General of BMET, Md. Nazibul Islam, Additional Secretary of MoEWOE, Md. Khalilur Rahman, Divisional Commissioner of Dhaka, and Giorgi Gigauri, Chief of Mission, IOM Bangladesh, attended the event. A total of 27 Executive Magistrates from Dhaka and Mymensingh division joined the first batch of training. The training programme was facilitated by government officials, lawyers and migration experts.

Advocacy workshop in Sirajganj:

IOM Bangladesh in collaboration with BRAC as the Secretariat of the National Alliance for Migrants' Rights Bangladesh (NAMRB) organized an advocacy workshop on 9 March 2021 in Sirajganj.

Dr. Farook Ahmed, Deputy Commissioner of Sirajganj District chaired the workshop. A wide range of stakeholders including government officials, Civil Service Organization (CSOs), media personnel and development practitioners participated in the workshop which provided an orientation on migration governance and reintegration issues.













Policy brief on strategic guidance on The Impact of COVID-19 Pandemic on GCM Implementation in Bangladesh:

To support the Government of Bangladesh, IOM in collaboration with Bangladesh UN Network on Migration developed a policy brief on strategic guidance on GCM implementation in light of COVID-19 contextualizing global guidance. Awareness Raising

Content for online course on Financial Literacy and Remittance Management:

Due to the limited financial knowledge among migrants and their families, remittance is being used inefficiently. It's also a major challenge that there is no easily accessible platform to learn about financial literacy. To address this challenge, IOM Bangladesh is developing a simple and accessible online training course to educate the migrants and their families, the community and migration-related service providers about financial literacy and remittance management. The content of the online course on financial literacy and remittance management was finalized with preparations for the course material to be made available on an appropriate information platform currently underway.

Monitoring and Evaluation

Reintegration Assistance Sustainability Survey (RASS) and Reintegration Sustainable Survey (RSS):

The data collection under the Reintegration Assistance Sustainability Survey (RASS) and reintegration Sustainable Survey (RSS) was conducted between December 2020 to January 2021. The data analysis and draft report of the surveys were completed and the report was reviewed in March and will be finalized in April 2021.

The survey reached 1093 beneficiaries under the RSS and 965 under the RASS, respectively. It aimed to measure the sustainability of the reintegration services received by the returnees as well as the satisfaction of beneficiaries after accessing reintegration services under Prottasha project. IOM introduced RSS to standardize the measurement of sustainable reintegration support and satisfaction with surveys in line with its Institutional Guidance on M&E of Assisted Voluntary Return/Reintegration (AVR/AVRR) and Post Arrival Reintegration Assistance (PARA) projects.



Prottasha Management Information System (ProMIS)- Phase 3:

With the revisions introduced to the Prottasha project including the time line extension, the M&E tools were aslo modified in line with the revised Description of Activities (DoA). Accordingly, the ProMIS platform - an android based interface for digitizing the entire M&E system of the project - will be modified and revised to reflect the said changes. As part of the ProMIS - phase 3, IOM Bangladesh commissioned a service provider to update the system by incorporating new M&E tools on telecounselling and stimulus grant to report against relevant output and outcome indicators.
