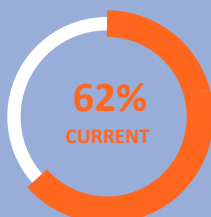


KEY FINDINGS

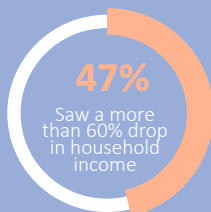
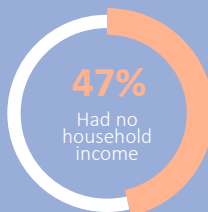
In an effort to gain insight into the needs and vulnerabilities of Bangladeshi migrant returnees as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak, IOM, financed by the European Union under the regional program the Regional Evidence for Migration Analysis and Policy (REMAP), completed data collection among 2,765 respondents, 1,279 of whom were internal returnees (migrants who had returned to their home district from elsewhere inside Bangladesh). INCOME AND EMPLOYMENT

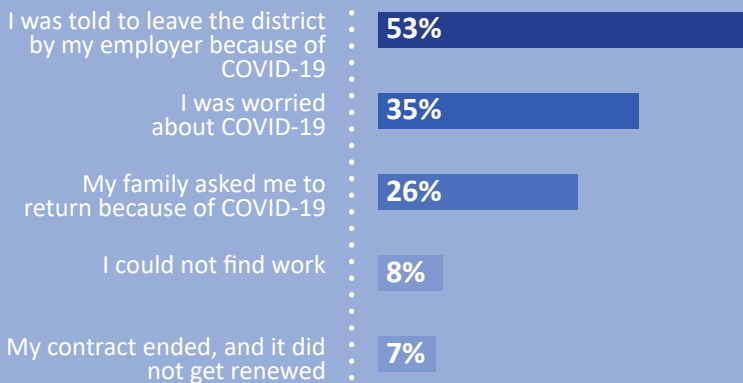
Rate of unemployment among respondents

RETURN REASONS



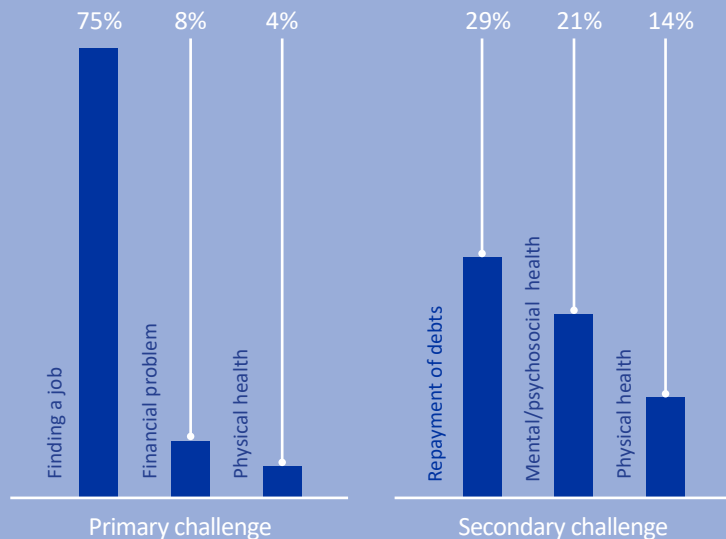
