## TECHNICAL SUPPORT TO BUREAU OF MANPOWER, EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING (BMET) ON OVERSEAS MARKET INFORMATION AND TO BANGLADESHI MIGRANT WORKERS ON 'RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING' (RPL)

The project aims to build the capacity BMET to collect information from employers in selected destination countries and disseminate the information to migrant workers in Bangladesh. This will be done through the BMET 'Information Cell' which will be strengthened through staff training and the development of a Standard Operating Procedures.

A longitudinal study of migrant workers accessing RPL services and services from the 'Information Cell' will be conducted to inform planning of the up-scaling of this intervention.

IOM will support BMET in implementing 'Recognition of Prior Learning' (RPL) certification for two construction-based skills courses, through the development of assessment standards, training of assessors and certification of 100 migrant workers.

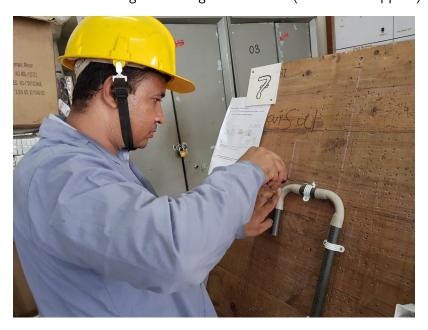
